- WPTE total 25 people + 1 invited speaker

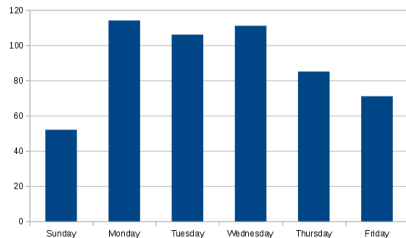

Number of RDP participants in 2011 and 2013:

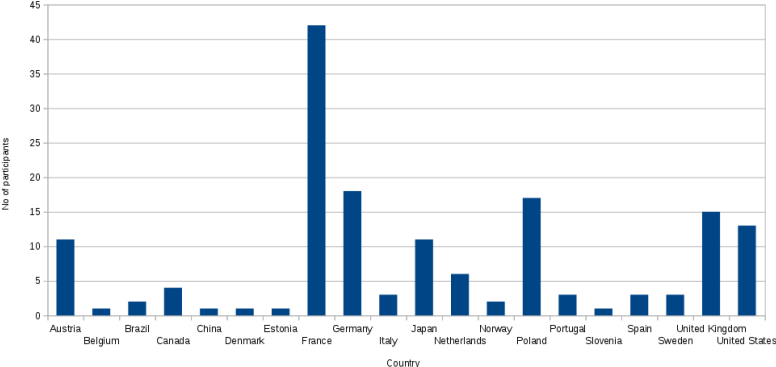

FSCD Aims and Scope

The scope of FSCD is intended to include and significantly expand the subject areas of RTA and TLCA. The initial list of topics in the FSCD Declaration is by no means exhaustive and will evolve over time.

The FSCD'16 Call For Papers is already under construction and comments are welcome.

FSCD Aims and Scope

The Important Issue:

- ▶ Do we want to make the step forward and have a new larger conference?

The unimportant issues:

- ▶ The exact wording of the list of topics (because it will evolve over time);
- ▶ The exact wording of the rules (because they will be revised in two years).

Technical Ballot

The voting will decide on an important issue.
Should a qualified majority be required?

- ▶ Approval of FSCD only by 2/3 majority (YES)?
- ▶ Decision taken by ordinary majority (NO)?

The Main Ballot

It is the will of the participants of RDP 2015 gathered at the Business Meeting on July 1, 2015, to terminate the RTA and TLCA conferences and introduce from 2016 on a new conference called

FSCD conference aims to cover all aspects of formal structures in computation and deduction from theoretical foundations to tools and applications. We do not only encourage submissions falling into all areas traditionally covered by RTA and TLCA, but also papers covering any of the new topics listed at the web-site.

- ▶ Size of PC: 30 members, covering all areas (2/3 RTA + TLCA, 1/3 new areas)
- ▶ Single-blind reviews
- ▶ Author response period
- ▶ Up for discussion with 2016 PC for FSCD
